Shoreline East Railroad Guilford Station

The Guilford Station was built to replace an older existing lower platform deck. The new station has increased access and service. It offers handicap accessibility, high-level platforms for level boarding on trains, a commuter shelter area, a convenient drop-off area, increased parking and enhanced lighting.

The new station blends well with the historical town of Guilford, and serves hundreds of customers a day. The Connecticut Department of Transportation specified metal roofing, particularly IMETCO roofing, because of its aesthetics and design flexibility, as well as longevity and resistance to the harsh weather conditions of coastal New England.

Guilford Station's construction is part of a \$25 million effort on the part of the Connecticut Department of Transportation to improve safety and operations of Shore Line East. Several other stations have been completed already.



Approximately 15,000 sq. ft. of IMETCO's Series 300 Symmetrical standing seam high-performance roofing panels, manufactured from .040" aluminum, were used on the project. The color chosen was Shipyard Gray, a custom color for the Connecticut Department of Transportation. The project was completed in November 2005.
